

Dr. Joseph Jeffries Wilson became principal of A. J. Moore High School in 1934 upon the death of his then principal father, Burtrust Tobias Wilson, from 1934 until it closed its doors in 1971. There is perhaps no other principal in the history of segregated schools in Central Texas that had more impact on students, teachers, and parents than Dr. Joseph Jeffries Wilson who was known by all simply as Professor J. J. Wilson. Upon closing of A. J. Moore High School, Professor Wilson became the first Black to be appointed as Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Schools.

When. Professor Wilson became principal, he expanded the boundaries of the established high standards of academic excellence at Moore High and forever sealed its reputation as a role model in the groves of high school academes. The students were the focal point and Professor Wilson led by example nurturing and supporting teachers as they dedicated themselves to helping students develop the skills and knowledge necessary to achieve their fullest potential.

Submit the required number of letters of reference with each application from their high school counselor, a teacher, and another individual who have knowledge of the applicant's capabilities. These letters must be in sealed envelopes from the individuals providing the reference letters.
